Chick Flick youngsters beat the older Duke City. It's well known that the Duke City Shootout Competition brings some of the country's up-and-coming filmmakers to Albuquerque to turn their original screenplays into 12-minute movies.
But with the inauguration of the Intel MiniCini competition during the 2006 Shootout, which invited creative teams to write, act, shoot and edit three-minute movies on a deadline, the field was open to

an even wider range of talent. And, apparently, the adults in future competitions had better keep an eye out for the next generation - specifically the third graders and teenagers. The winning movie of the MiniCini event, "The Girls and Poker Face," was created by a team of five young ladies, ranging in age from 8 to 17, who beat out 25 other short film competitors to win the prize, a new Apple computer. The victorious gals are Jennifer Baker, 11; Lindsey Baker, 10; Kristen Baker, 8; and twin sisters Kathleen and Samantha Capshaw, 17.

Founded in 2000, the Duke City Shootout is a high-definition, digital filmmaking competition where winning screenwriters are paired with professional mentors for seven days to shoot, edit and show 12-minute screenplays.
